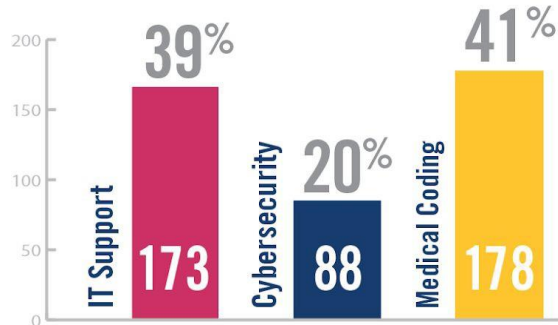

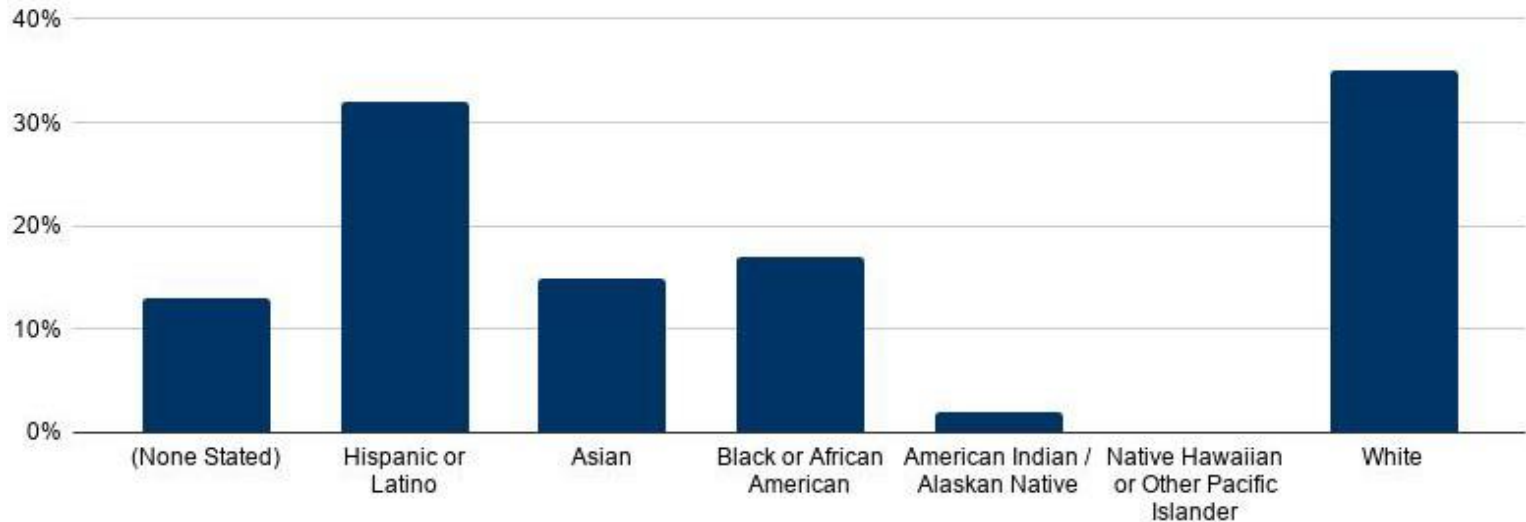

Our first Chromebook and MiFi numbers are likely an under representation of total need. While a fix is imminent, only learners with access to a computer can complete the application.

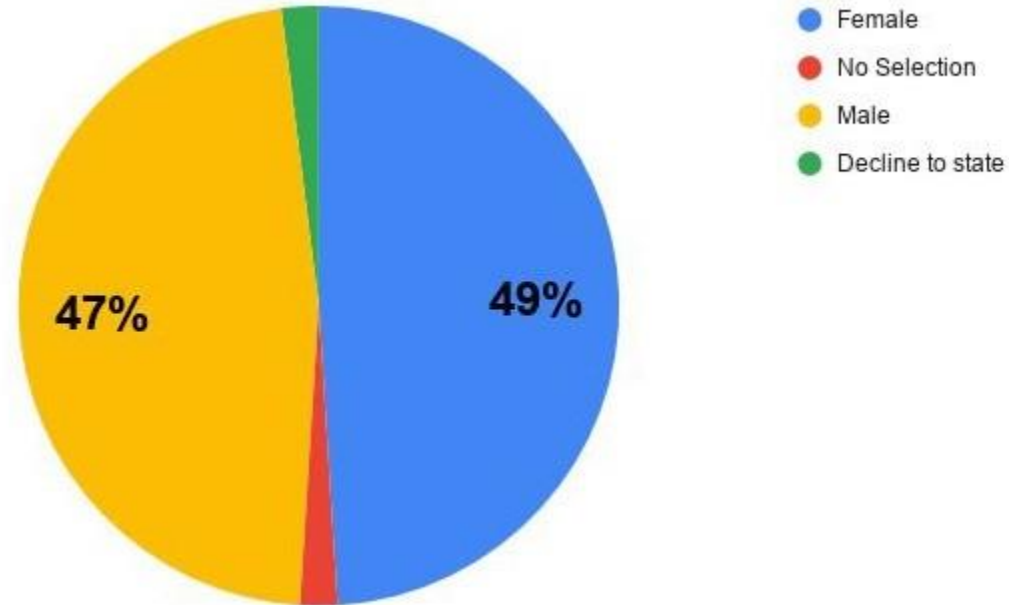

Percent of Enrolled Learners Who Identify as the Following



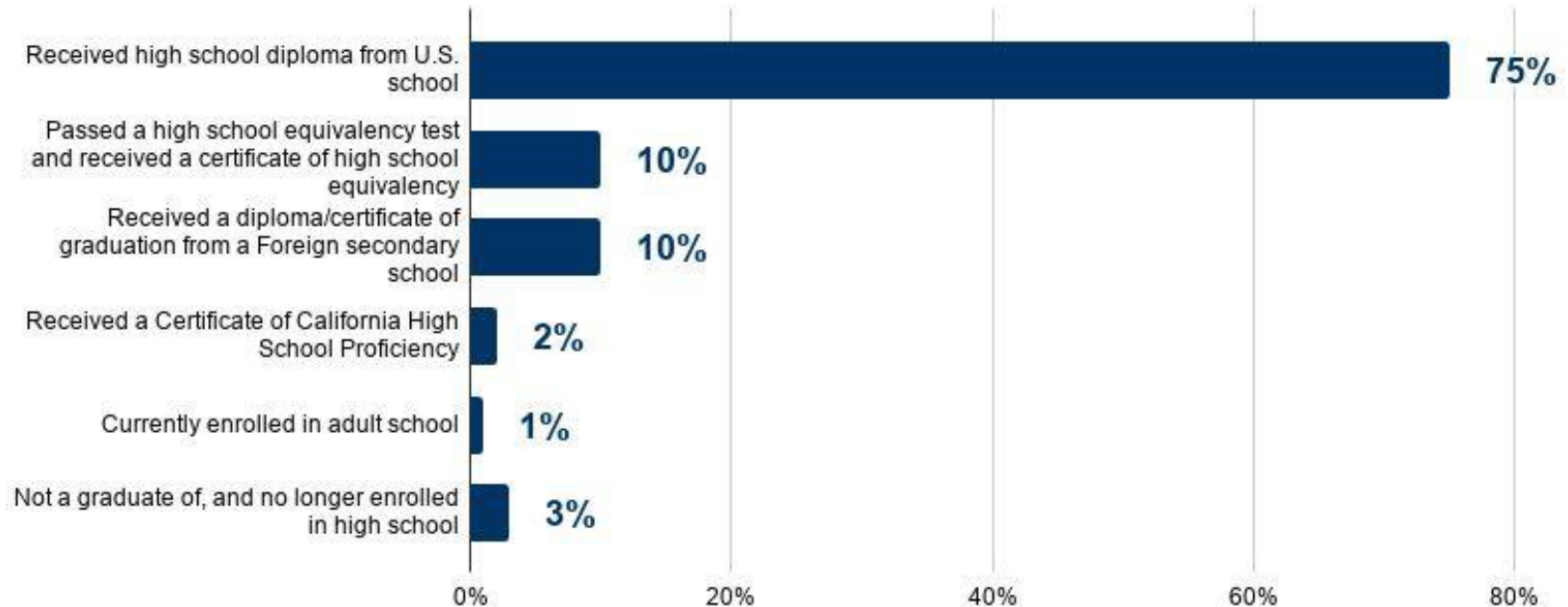

Percent of Enrolled Learners Who Identify as the Following



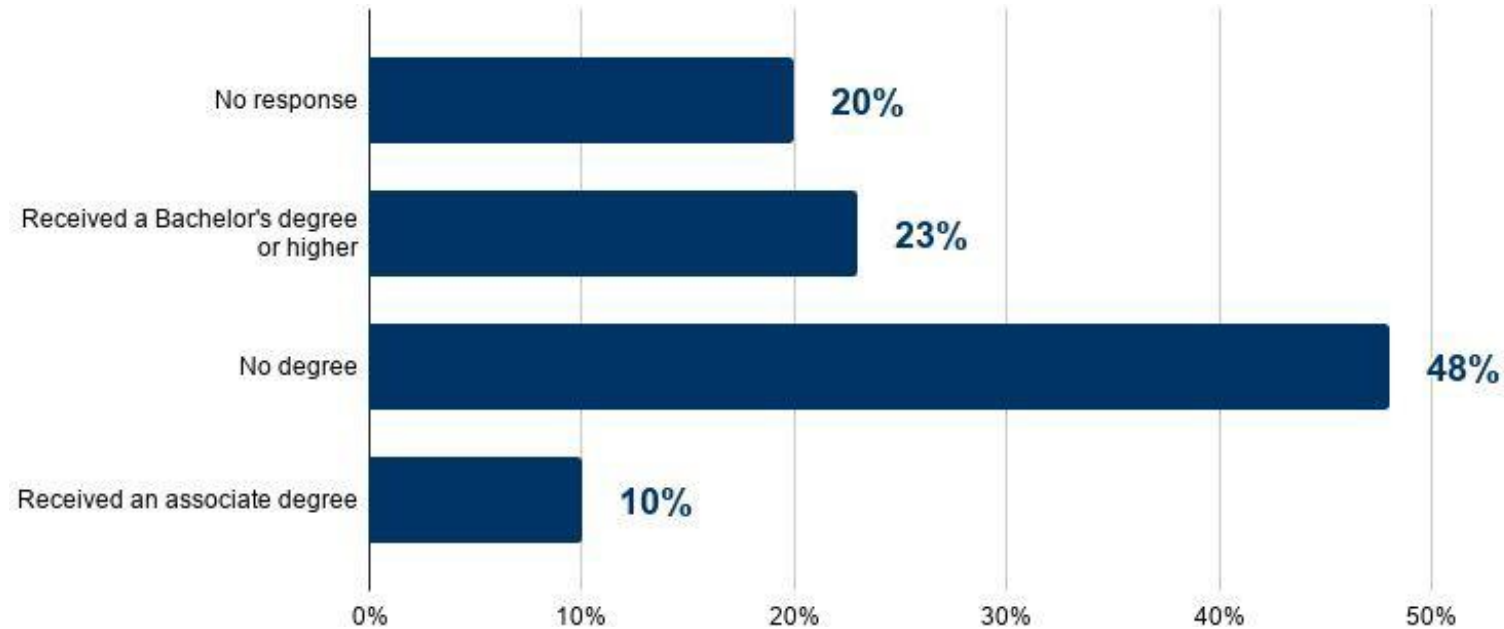

Education Level of Applicants: Highest High School Level



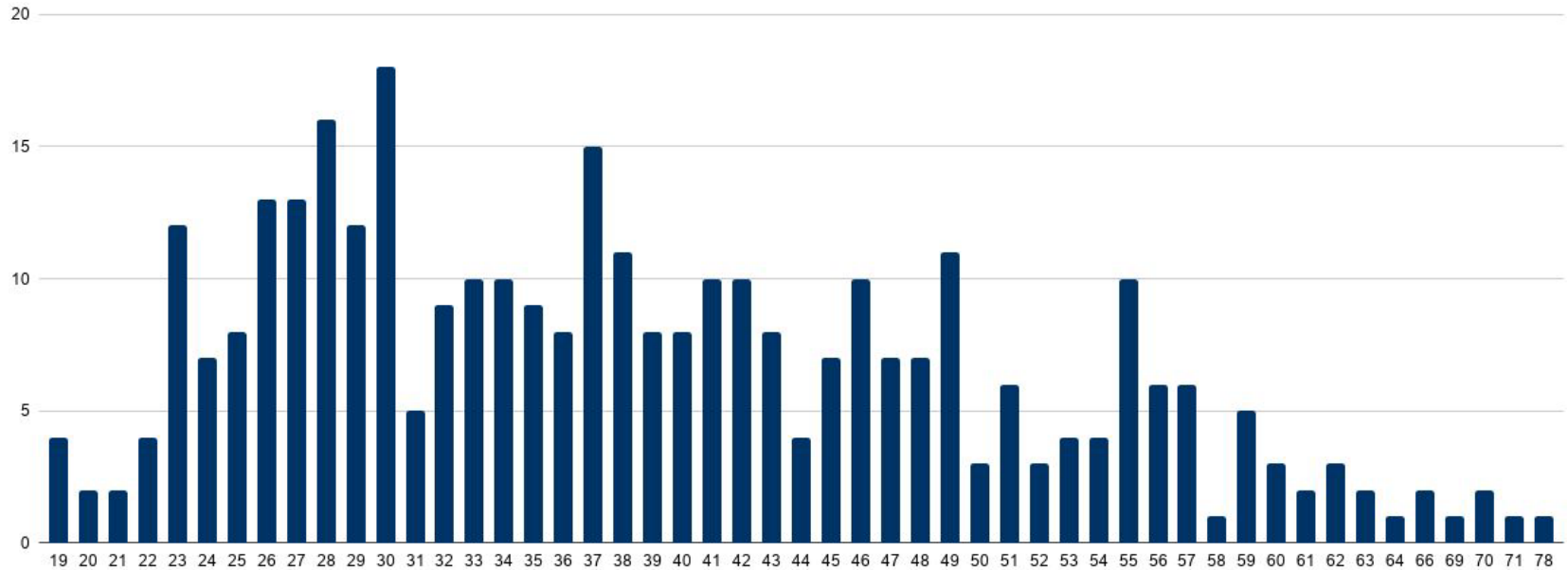

Education Level of Applicants: Highest College Level



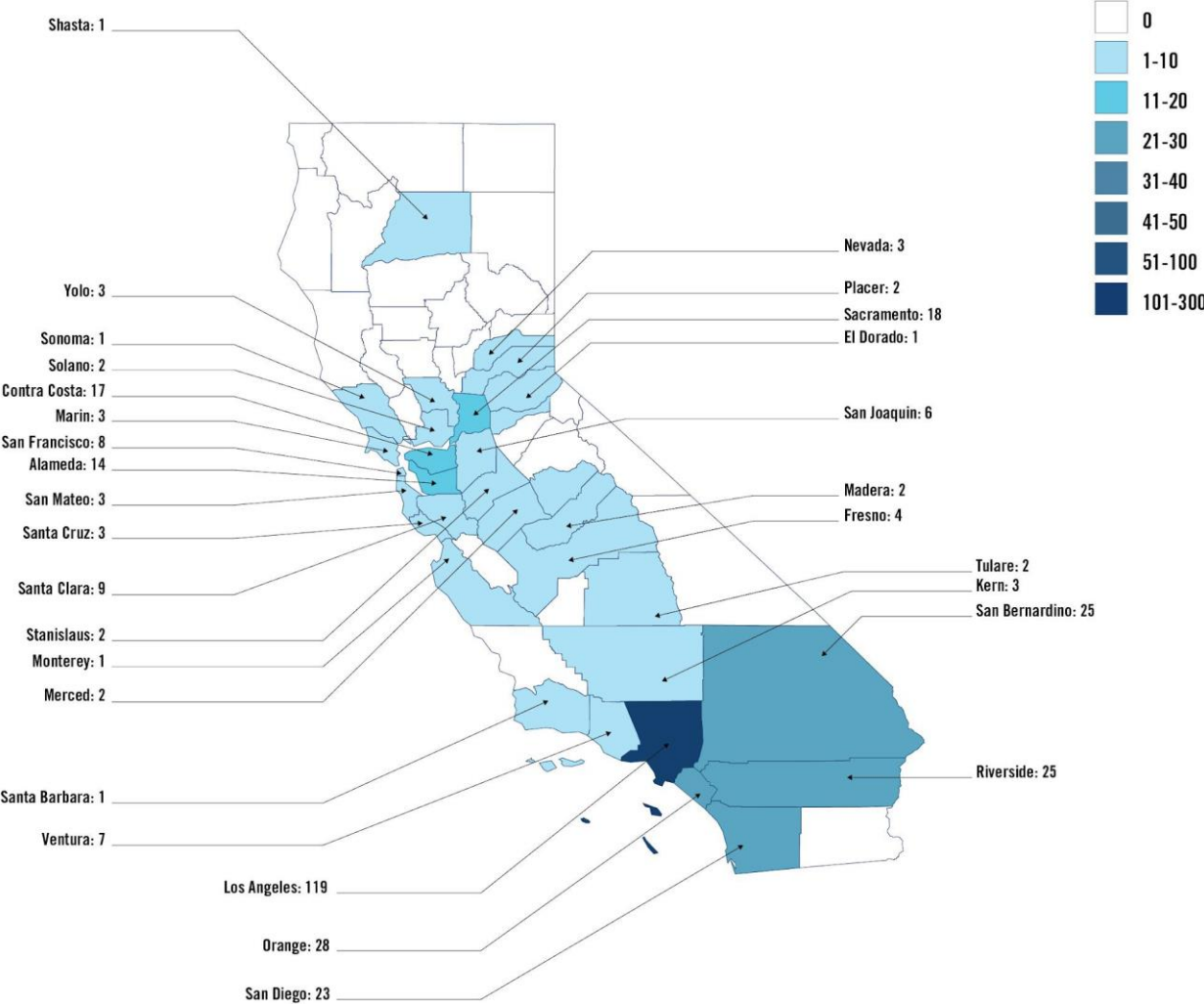

Accreditation Update

Calbright is in the initial stages of preparing to submit an application for eligibility to pursue national accreditation with the Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC). Calbright will become eligible to submit an application to DEAC any time after October 2020. DEAC is able to accredit institutions that do not offer associate degrees. Calbright is preparing its programs, processes, and structures in order to successfully achieve the legislated accreditation milestones within the specified timelines.

Per Ed Code 75007 (b) (1): The college shall seek accreditation and meet requirements for students to become eligible for federal and state financial aid. Legislated Deadlines:

1. (75007) (b)(1)(i) By April 1, 2021: a detailed accreditation plan is due with:
 - a. accrediting agency identified,
 - b. accreditation process outlined (including process for meeting the 2022 and 2025 deadlines).
2. (75009) By July 1, 2021: Application for Accreditation submitted.
3. (75007) By April 1, 2022: Evidence of accreditation candidacy / pre-accreditation achieved.
4. (75007) By April 1, 2025: evidence of full accreditation achieved.
